President's Report

The recent 2015 Master Builders Tasmania Housing and Construction Excellence Awards was extremely well supported with 104 entries that had a combined construction value of \$270m. Clearly evident was the diversity and high standard of projects that Tasmania is consistently renowned for producing. Awards judge Mr Tim Holmes said: "the one thing that characterised excellent outcomes was the passion of the builder". Interstate industry guests also positively commented on impressive projects that will now go forward to the National Awards to be held in November on the Gold Coast. Tasmania punches well above its weight on many fronts and building and construction is no exception. In 2014 five Tasmanian projects went onto to receive National recognition. The winning categories and projects were:

- National Excellence in Workplace Health and Safety Award – Hansen Yuncken Pty Ltd– Cat and Fiddle Arcade Stage 6
- National Commercial / Industrial Construction Award \$50m to \$100m – John Holland / Fairbrother Joint Venture – UTAS Medical Sciences 2
- National Commercial / Industrial Award \$10 to \$20m – Vos Construction and Joinery Pty Ltd – Devonport Aquatic Centre
- National Commercial /Industrial Construction Award under \$5m – Fairbrother Pty Ltd – St Patricks College Edmund Rice Centre
- National Medium Density Construction 2 -5 dwellings – Lyden Builders – Oceana Project

This is an impressive achievement and highlights the professionalism of Master Builders Tasmania members. Hopefully we can add to our tally at this year's National Awards.

More impressive is our track record with training apprentices. Master Builders Tasmania's Construction Apprentice of the Year has gone onto win the National Award seven times since 2003. This is a remarkable feat and clearly demonstrates the broad training and opportunities for advanced learning that our apprentices receive in this state.

Ensuring we maintain adequate levels of apprentices in training is critical for the sustainability of our local industry. The quieter period over recent years has unfortunately led to a significant drop off in apprentice numbers. Fortunately, thanks to an improving economy, our industry is rebounding and the brighter outlook should herald an increase in apprenticeship

commencements. This must be a focus for all construction industry stakeholders.

Recently a major milestone was achieved for the betterment of the industry and ultimately the community. The merger of the Tasmanian Builders Association, with a 97-year history, and Master Builders Tasmania, in existence for 124 years, brings together two long-standing and respected industry associations. This has resulted in a stronger organisation with greater and more efficient services to support its combined membership.

Congratulations to all award winners. Equally important, thank you to all award entrants for taking the time to promote your projects and allowing our local industry to showcase its highly commendable capabilities. Also thank you to the sponsors. Their continued support makes events like this possible and allows the industry to recognise these excellent achievements.

We appreciate the vision and investment generated by clients and the design input from architects and designers that, together with professional builders, make these award-winning projects a reality.

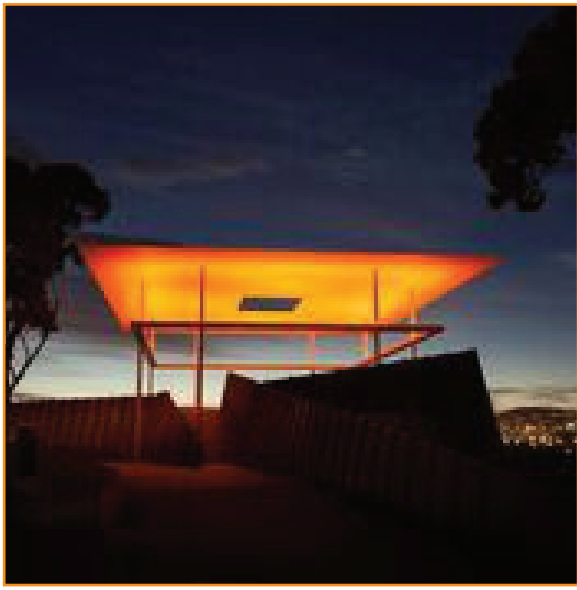

There were strict budgets and time constraints with this unit development. The project commenced and was completed within a six month period. Featuring Tasmanian Oak overlay floors, tiled floors in the wet areas and entry foyers. Selected quality fixture and fittings, have been installed throughout.

Both units have an expansive burnished concrete polished deck, and attractive frameless glass balustrades offer clear visibility to the 180 degree views of the Derwent and completes this attractive project.



EXCELLENCE IN MEDIUM DENSITY - OVER 5 DWELLINGS

Situated within walking distance from the centre of Latrobe, JPO Building Contractors have completed a development which consists of seven units on a unique parcel of land. There were originally generous timeframes but with some strict scheduling the builder managed to not only complete the unit

construction two months early, but also completed all the landscaping and concrete works, which was not a part of their original tender. This made for a satisfied client who was able to sell the properties sooner than expected.



RENOVATION / ADDITION - UNDER \$150,000

This project involved the design, manufacture and installation of inside and outside kitchens in a waterfront property in Sandy Bay. The benchtop material extended past the cabinets up to the glazing channel on both sides of the glass to give the appearance of the glazing being fitted to the benchtop. The

waterfront views, are unhindered by the soft, clean, white cabinets. The contrast of dark timber display shelving was used to decorate the front of the island, with an exquisite marble bar top.

RENOVATION / ADDITION - OVER \$150,000

WINNER

Project: Colville Residence

This heritage listed Edwardian era family home, has had its interior extensively renovated and a second level added. There was a heritage condition that the front facade of the home had to be retained and the builder went to great lengths to copy the downstairs façade. The builder made 15 test samples of the stucco for approval to keep the

exterior in character but the building is ultra-modern and sleek on the inside. A cool, calm and sophisticated edge, this functional home is enveloped in light and comfort. Crisp white walls, timber floors and high ceilings create a style as timeless as the sparkling ocean view.



DWELLING CONSTRUCTION - UNDER \$200,000

The Tamarleigh Garden Pavilion captures the beautiful ambience of its surrounding gardens - it was designed and constructed to provide an outside dining area and to feature an original 1906 Benzoline generator. The modern pavilion sits comfortably alongside its period Launceston home and adds a

sculptural quality to its property. The fine quality of the construction and the sensitive design make this an outstanding project.



DWELLING CONSTRUCTION - \$200,000 TO \$350,000

The residence was a design build project. The client wanted a passive solar, two bedroom modern design that would be different in design to other houses in the area. celebrated in the interior. By working with the renewable energy consultant from the outset of the project, the balance of client needs, site conditions and energy efficient technologies is successfully realised.



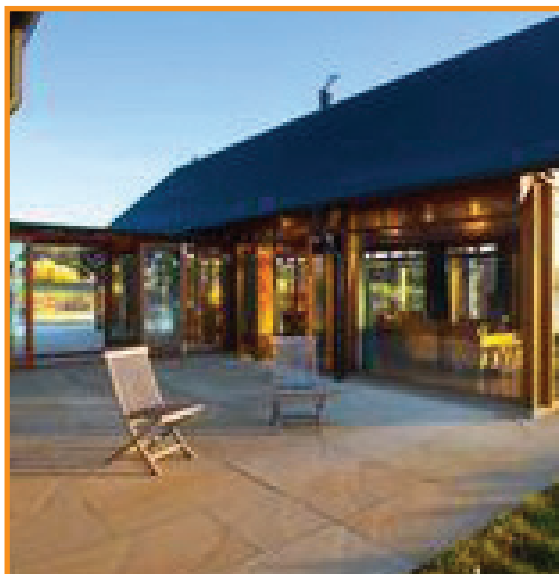
DWELLING CONSTRUCTION - \$500,000 TO \$750,000

Hebel packs, weighing around 80 kg were craned up onto the scaffold – backbreaking work but worth it. The end result is amazing – from the wonderful deck to the design of the roof over the rear entertaining area where the builder and

the engineer worked with the clients to come up with solutions they were happy with. To complement the amazing build, outside works were taken on as an extra including the external retaining walls, the washed aggregate steps and the driveway. The hard work has paid off; the clients and the builder are very happy with the end result and this property is a most worthy winner.



DWELLING CONSTRUCTION - \$750,000 TO 1 MILLION

Set against idyllic water views, two pitched-roofed pavilions are connected by a glass walled link. The lavish use of timber creates a natural, rural, character: macrocarpa exterior cladding, hoop pine plywood ceilings, western red cedar window frames, Tasmanian oak tongued and grooved floorboards. Satin stainless steel door

handles and hinges add an understated touch of modern elegance. This project had the perfect location and a stunning design. The builder has made the most of a wonderful opportunity by producing a dwelling that has the hallmarks of a boat builder- precision craftsmanship.

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DWELLING CONSTRUCTION - OVER \$1 MILLION

Project: Vautin Residence

The client required that their home be designed to take advantage of the wonderful north facing views, have level access and create a warm, welcoming atmosphere. The site was challenging because of the steepness and large amounts of rock that required blasting. Internal features include solid Blackwood

wall linings and doors, underfloor heating, French provincial style joinery in the kitchen and bathrooms with granite benches. Excellent tradesmen and subcontractors played an integral role in the planning and building of this fine home. The clients are very happy with their finished home.



EXCELLENCE IN HERITAGE LISTED OR PERIOD HOME RESTORATION / RENOVATION - OPEN VALUE

WINNER

Project: Colonial Cottage, Sorell Creek, New Norfolk
NT & JE Browning and Son

The project is a colonial cottage restoration, the original cottage, circa 1870, has been lovingly restored and extended. The original structure was strengthened and braced, and period features include a convict brick chimney, fireplace, Georgian mantle, doors and

Blackwood flooring were retained. The modern addition includes a sandstone atrium connecting new to old. The cottage has been transformed, and the difficulties of nothing being square or level were overcome along the way.



CIVIL CONSTRUCTION

WINNER

Project: Toll Brighton Distribution and Warehouse Facility
Vos Construction and Joinery Pty Ltd

Vos used nearly 10,000m³ of concrete finishers, applied specific grit finishes to over 45,000m² of pavement and well over 50,000 tonnes of quarry product were used. Paving contractors laid 700,000 high load pavers in 10 weeks. Vos and their project partners utilised innovative methods of sub base stabilisation to reduce excavation of

existing materials and truck movements. All works on site during the construction stage proceeded at great speed with up to 3 site managers operating in different zones. Vos very much appreciated the skill and expertise of all the Tasmanian trades and consultants who had input into this outstanding Tasmanian infrastructure project.



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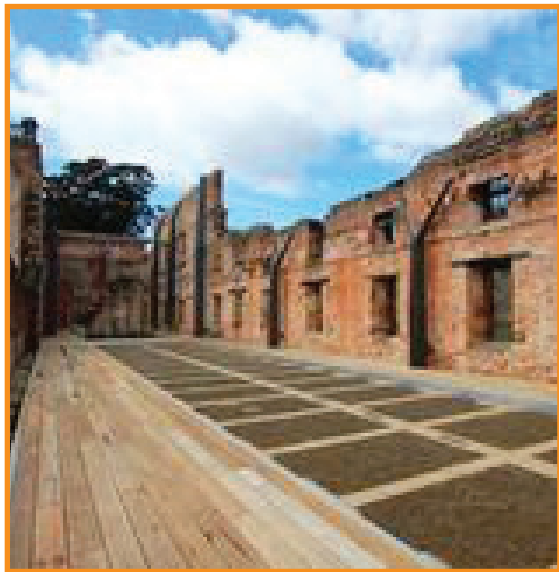
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HERITAGE LISTED OR PERIOD BUILDING CONSERVATION - OPEN VALUE

WINNER

Project: Port Arthur Precinct Conservation Project
Hansen Yuncken Pty Ltd

The building penitentiary was originally constructed during the early 1840s. It was gutted by fires during the 1890s. The work has been necessary to ensure the safety of visitors and guarantee the long term conservation of the building. The conservation works included major excavation, under pinning, grout sock anchor installation and the fixing of

massive steel support columns. The project has been a landmark project for the client, the Port Arthur Historical Site Management Authority and demonstrates a capacity to deliver best practice conservation works to a building within a World Heritage listed site using local skills and labour.



HERITAGE LISTED OR PERIOD BUILDING RESTORATION / RENOVATION - OPEN VALUE

WINNER

Project: Pumphouse Point Mead Con

The client brief consisted of the refurbishment of two derelict buildings on the Pumphouse Point site located inside World Heritage listed Lake St Claire National Park in the remote central Tasmanian highlands. After decades of inactivity, the former Hydro pump station, perched 250m out into the lake, and the old workshop/sub-station building were to be transformed into a

boutique wilderness retreat. The facades of both buildings were to remain as they were; they had to create a silk purse from a sow's ear. Ambience within the building was achieved by using a subtle tonal balance of timber, glass and colour enhancing the natural light and exterior outlook. The end result is remarkable, considering the obstacles to conquer throughout the project.



LIFESTYLE HOUSING FOR SENIORS - OPEN VALUE

WINNER

Project: Fairway Rise Aged Care
Fairbrother Construction

Southern Cross Care engaged Fairbrother to build a 90 Bed Residential Aged Care Facility that would enable specialist aged care plus sharing of common facilities with the residents of the Lifestyle Village. It is to cater for ageing in a special place and to provide sub-acute care facilities for seniors requiring nursing services. There is

adequate provision for unobtrusive car parking for staff, visitors and visiting service providers, including a sheltered wet weather access point. The building is massive but the attention to detail is minute.



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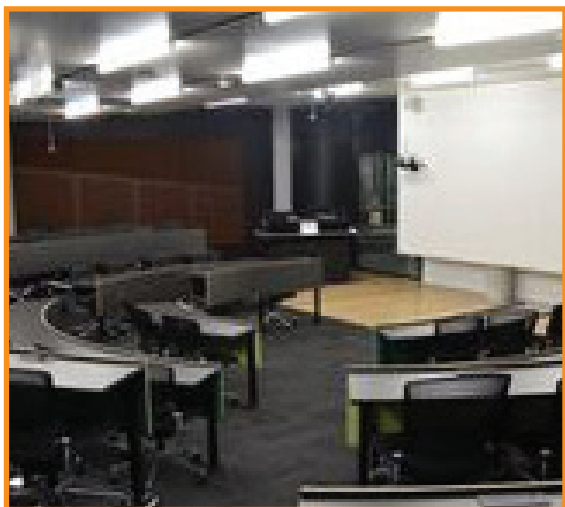
RENOVATION / FITOUT - UNDER \$1 MILLION

Project: Neil Buckby Motors - Jaguar / Landrover Showroom
Paul McKenzie Building Solutions

This project consisted of the part demolition of existing offices and extension of floor area to create a new car showroom, office space, meeting room, kitchenette and bathroom for Landrover/ Jaguar dealership. All refurbishments on the dealership were completed in strict accordance with their latest module concept

specification. Located in a high traffic, inner city location in Launceston the project included driving 29 steel piles for underpinning with difficult access to the site. The outcome is a sleek, modern glass fronted building with exceptional internal fitout allowing the showcasing of prestige vehicles.



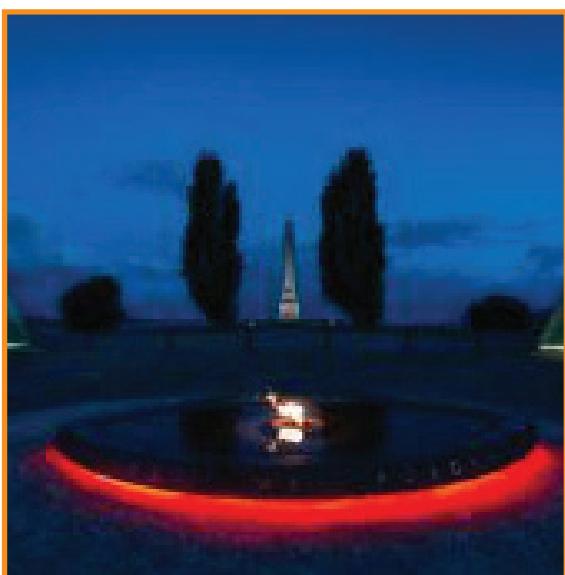
RENOVATION / FITOUT - OVER \$1 MILLION

Project: UTAS Centenary Building
Fairbrother Construction

This project involved the renovation of the existing Centenary Building on the Sandy Bay campus of the University of Tasmania. There were many challenges faced throughout this project including a tight time frame of eighteen weeks. This meant strict project planning and co-

ordination of all trades to pull everything together. High quality finishes were achieved throughout the building. The building has been transformed into a state of the art learning facility for the school of business.



NEW CONSTRUCTION - UNDER \$1 MILLION

Project: Hobart War Memorial Flame of Remembrance
Tascon Constructions

Located in a prominent position on the Queen's Domain, the Flame of Remembrance is a memorial for all who have given their lives serving their country. The attention to detail with the design created a number of unique challenges including some very complex services in a pond that continually fills with water which flows gently over

the central flame creating a cascading waterfall effect. Given the unique design of the precast units - the fabrication and even the delivery and installation created numerous challenges. The ANZAC Day ceremony was the deadline and required complete commitment from all contractors and suppliers to meet it.

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NEW CONSTRUCTION - \$1 MILLION TO \$2 MILLION

WINNER

Project: 2 Kennedy (Stage 1)
Lyden Builders

This building is the first stage of a four stage project by Lyden Builders. The building is constructed using concrete precast panels with a mix of “Scyon Stria” to the façade. Three of the four warehouses were purchased early on in the building process which allowed for initial designs to be modified to cater

for individual client requirements. The office fit outs have been tailored to the individual business requirements. The functionality of design and the build quality has resulted in the development becoming a sought after location.



NEW CONSTRUCTION - \$2 MILLION TO \$5 MILLION

WINNER

Project: Moonah Arts Centre
Vos Construction & Joinery Pty Ltd

The Moonah Arts Centre is an eye catching community arts facility located in central Moonah. This project presented a number of unique challenges, and the end result is a first class community building. The windows are designed to allow major architectural elements to penetrate through and around the glazing façade, achieving

a free following effect internally and externally. Glazed bi-fold doors were installed to the Courtyard area providing unrestricted access to adjoining function areas. This vibrant building inspires and engages the arts community and is a credit to Vos Construction and its designers.



NEW CONSTRUCTION - \$5 MILLION TO \$10 MILLION

WINNER

Project: Brooke Street Pier
Fairbrother Construction

The Brooke Street Pier is a very innovative new structure, one that is both a building and a boat; an 80m long 20m wide floating concrete pontoon, on which is constructed 3 floors of lightweight superstructure, all of which is now Hobart's new ferry terminal. The project represents a significant advance in creating a practical solution to building

out over the water, and indeed on the water. The structure also rises and falls with the tide, so it is anchored to the seabed. The cladding of the ferry pier is made of lightweight polycarbonate ribs creating a diaphanous skin and the skin lights up at night an antipodean Brighton pier!



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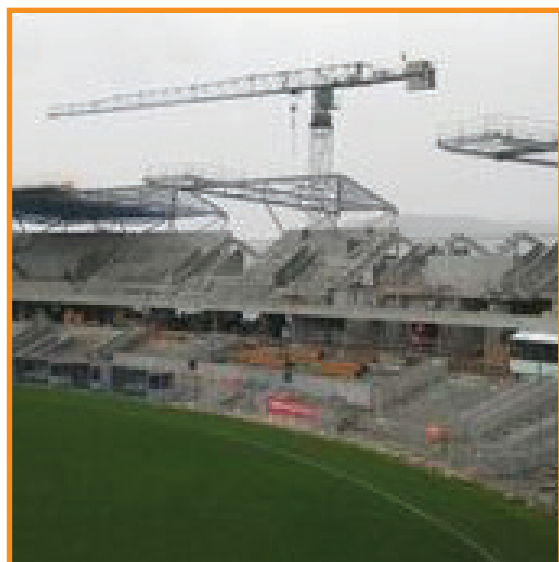
SOIL AND WATER MANAGEMENT

WINNER

Project: Blundstone Arena
Vos Construction & Joinery Pty Ltd

Showing a commitment to the environment . The project provided a good entry and exit point which included a wash down area for trucks that was concreted and had fall back into the site. Sediment fences were used along the perimeter to capture dirty run off and these worked well. Water from the site was pumped into a holding area before being discharged into the stormwater

system. Controls were specified in the planning documentation. Some of the specific measures included:- siltation matting as external fences; silt filters at gully pits for existing and new drainage systems; silt fences at gully pits also for existing and new drainage systems and use of Geofabric to maintain soil loss and collapse of soil banks during the construction.



WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY (WHS)

WINNER

Project: Blundstone Arena
Vos Construction & Joinery Pty Ltd

This year's winner stood out from the rest and clearly identified in their application the specific challenges of the project and how these were tackled and the effectiveness measured. The project was audited by an independent third party as well as the FSC and passed in both instances without any non-compliance. One of the major challenges

was the high concentration of various contractors having to work within a small area under tight timelines and still make sure that the safety aspects were not neglected and everybody got back home safe at the end of the day. Congratulations for a difficult job. Well done goes to VOS for the Blundstone Arena Project.



SPECIALIST CONTRACTOR OF THE YEAR

WINNER

Heritage Roofing Company

This project relied on the contractor's previous experience as a copper and zinc worker in Europe where he worked on heritage listed castles. On this residence, its complicated roof shape, shallow pitch and its exposure to the elements added to the challenge of fitting copper sheets up to 11.5 metres long with standing seam profiles. There was 1.7 kilometres

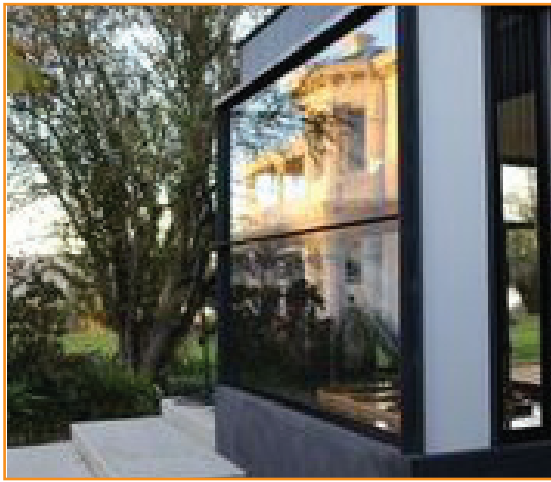
of seam crimped manually on site and 4.6 tons of copper used to create this visually stunning roof with only one tradesman and one assistant throughout the installation, and there were no leaks.



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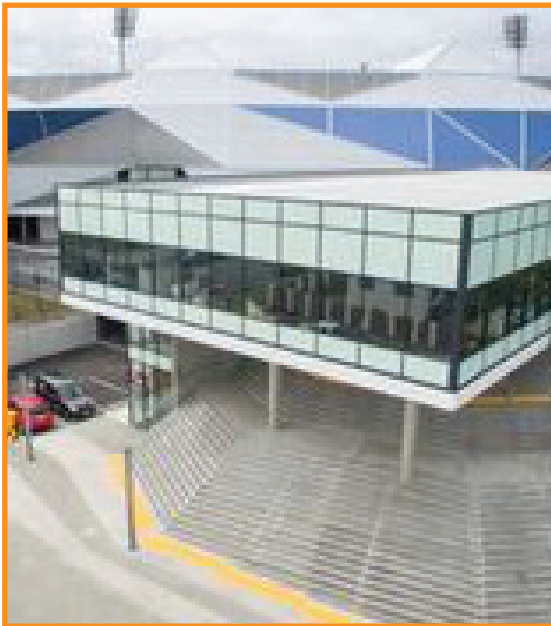


BEST USE OF GLASS

Project: Tamarleigh Garden Pavilion
R and S Rosier Constructions Pty Ltd

The construction of an outside dining area has resulted in a thoroughly wonderful project that complements the beautiful period home and surrounding gardens. The side glass entrance and magnificent glass doors which take up one side of the building allow almost the entire area to be opened up to the

outside and enhances the blend of old and new. The use of glass enables a visual display of historical features and modern architecture. An original 1906 Benzoline generator sits proudly in a stunning glass enclosure and is placed in its original position adjacent to the tower structure of the residence.



NEW CONSTRUCTION - \$10 MILLION TO \$50 MILLION

WINNER

Project: Blundstone Arena
Vos Construction & Joinery Pty Ltd

This project consisted of demolition of existing structures and the construction of a new Western Grandstand (4,500 seats) including new members and corporate areas, players change room, training and media spaces and additional hospitality spaces. Also included was a new 3 level administration block with turnstiles entrance, concourse, basement car park, site works and landscaping. The design was particularly challenging due to the original design

architects not having full involvement during construction stage. Vos assisted in meeting the clients' budget requirements by offering a number of savings for alternative designs and materials, including the redesign of the Western Stand roof. Overall the project is a complete success and an excellent example of Tasmanian construction professionalism and ingenuity within tight budgets and timeframes.



NEW CONSTRUCTION - OVER \$50 MILLION

Project: Project Frost
Fairbrother Construction

Fairbrother were appointed as Managing Contractors to carry out a major expansion of the existing cheese manufacturing facility in Burnie. The aim of the project was to create a state of the art cheese facility that provided for consolidation of multiple cheese brands onto a single site. Key project challenges comprised - Maintaining production operations during the entire contract period; Coordination of construction
